He is the author of the books "Sobukwe and Apartheid" and "How can man die better: the life of Robert Sobukwe".

The Robert Sobukwe Papers contains extensive correspondence between Sobukwe and Pogrund and Sobukwe and his wife Veronica, as well as photographs and publications. The collection gives an insight into the life and struggle of Robert Sobukwe, and the history of the Pan Africanist Congress (PAC).
