INTRODUCTION

In 1972 the South African Institute of Race Relations transferred various archival collections to the University of the Witwatersrand. A number of these collections, including AD843/B contained the official records of the Institute. The "B" box collection was described in Inventory No.10, "Records of the South African Institute of Race Relations, Part I" published by the University Library in 1981. That collection relates mainly to the period 1930 to 1950. In 1990 the "RJ" collection was described in Inventory No.15 and published by the University Library as the 'Records of the South African Institute of Race Relations Part II'.

Since 1972 the South African Institute of Race Relations has continued to add to its collections. This collection, "Records of the Institute of Race Relations, Part III" was added in 1987 and relates mainly to the period 1947 - 1969, although there are some documents as early as 1932. The subject headings of the files have been retained, and arranged alphabetically. Consequently the contents and the files overlap.

This collection consists of correspondence and memoranda to and from the South African Institute of Race Relations. The principal correspondents are: Quintin Whyte and F.J. VanWyk, while others include M. Horrell, W.B. Ngakane and D. Rheinallt Jones.

Subjects covered are the social and economic conditions of Black South Africans, with particular reference to education, land, farm labour, labour relations, housing, township conditions, health, welfare, liquor, discriminatory legislation and penal reform.
