Abstract 5895 photographs on Southern Africa, mostly taken between 1970 and 2000, from the collections of the Dutch Anti-Apartheid Movement (AABN), the Institute for Southern Africa (IZA) and the Netherlands institute for Southern Africa (NiZA).

Context

Historical note

These photographs originally were part of the photo collections of the Dutch Anti-Apartheid Movement (AABN) and consequently the Institute for Southern Africa (IZA), which merged with other Dutch Southern Africa solidarity organisations into the Netherlands institute for Southern Africa (NiZA) in 1997. Other parts of the NiZA-collections with photographs on Southern Africa and solidarity activities in the Netherlands are processed in IISH collections 00150 and 00151.

Custodial History

The NiZA photo collection was transferred to the IISH in March 2008 and processed in 2008-2009. A significant part of the photo's were scanned in 2012 within the framework of an archival transfer project in coöperation with the ANC archives and other archives in South Africa.

Content and Structure

Content

Almost 5900 photographs on South(ern) Africa from the collection of the Dutch Anti-Apartheid Movement (AABN) and NiZA from the 1950s up till 2004. Unless otherwise indicated, all photographs are in black & white.

NB. 948 photographs in this collection have been digitized and are available in high resolution scans; yet, not all of these can be shown, because some photographers did not give the IISH permission to do so.

Arrangement

The original arrangement of the photo collections of AABN and NiZA was largely retained.

The photo's are arranged in geographical and thematic categories; all photographs individually numbered and with descriptions on the backside (except inv.nrs. 164-173). Inv.nrs. 212-214 are large prints, stored in a different box. Inv.nrs. 215-218 contain additional photographs made by Jan Stegeman in several South Africa cities in 1991/92.

The initial list was made by Kier Schuringa in 2012 and adapted by him in 2016.
