ON 1982.01.29 AT ABOUT 18H30 I WAS ON DUTY. I WAS WAITING AT THE BASEMENT OF JOHN VONSTER SQUARE WHEN LT. WHITHEAD, W/OFFICER DE BAYN, AND ANOTHER WHITE MALE CAME. LT. WHITHEAD ASKED ME TO ACCOMPANY HIM TO THE OFFICE AT THE 10TH FLOOR.

AT THE 10TH FLOOR WE WENT INTO THE OFFICE (OFFICE NO. 1020). IN OFFICE NO. 1020, LT. WHITHEAD ASKED ME TO BE WITH HIM WHILE DOING INVESTIGATION ON THE WHITE MALE. LT. WHITHEAD TOLD ME THAT THE NAME OF THE WHITE MALE IS DR NEIL AGGET.

DURING THE COURSE OF THE INVESTIGATION, I WAS MAKING COFFEE FOR US ALL AT INTERVALS. LT. WHITHEAD AND WARRANT OFFICER DE BAYN WERE QUESTIONING DR. NEIL AGGET, AND AFTER QUESTIONING, DR. AGGET DID THE WRITING. DURING THE COURSE OF THE INVESTIGATION, WE WERE ALL SEATED ON THE CHAIRS IN THE OFFICE.

AT ABOUT 231130 LT. WHITEHEAD AND W/OFFICER DE BRYN LEFT ME WITH DR. AGGET TO GO AND BUY FOOD. AFTER A PERIOD OF ABOUT FORTY-FIVE MINUTES, LT. WHITEHEAD AND W/OFFICER DE BRYN CAME BACK. LT. WHITEHEAD THEN GAVE DR. AGGET AND MYSELF EACH A HAMBURGER AND A PLAT MILK.

WE ALL SAT DOWN AND HAD OUR FOOD. AFTER HAVING FOOD, LT. WHITEHEAD TOLD DR. AGGET TO SLEEP ON A STRETCHER WHICH WAS IN THE DECK. HE THEN TOLD ME TO GO HOME.
