The following regulations in regard to counting of trords, figarea, bec., in "Ordinary" and "Press" Telograms are eifforced:-

1. Names of divisions, towns, villages, locations, settlefments, railway stations at which tuilie tele Foreigit Telegtraph Offices mentioned in the International Lilt of Telegraph Offices.
Recognised abbreviations, sach as "otc.," "can't," "don't," "couldn't," "oz,", "该, " "ewt.," "qt." "ft.," "まa.s" and "A.ta." and "p.m." (When used to datiote time).
2. Names of streets, squares, roads, lanes, Branch Telegraph Offices, sce., are counted according to the number of words employed; for example, Adderley Street, St, George's Street, Lansdowne Road, Skilor's Lane, dack count as two words, and Old Main street, New Church Street, each count as three words.
3. Figures are counted at the rate of five figdres to the word. For example, 384, 4589, 24689 each count as one word. Fractions are counted according to the number of figures उmployed, ons figure being added fot the mark of division-thus, 4 connts as ofie tofa,
 is always counted as a figure-thus, $10 / 2,287 / 4,189 \cdot 6$, each count as one word, $100 / 250$ counts as two words, and so on. The symbols $\%, a / 0, \mathrm{~b} \mid \mathrm{l}$, and o/o are each counted as one word.
4: Where a figure or a group of figures in followed or preceded by a letter, the letter is counted as one word thus:- 1000 a or A1000 connts as two words. An exoeption is however, made in the case of ordinal numbers, thus; -1 st , 1ste, 2de, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, each count as one word; $1000 t \mathrm{th}$, 1200 th , each as two words.
4. Single lettera, ningle figures, inverted commas, parentheses, underines and marke of commerce, such as oif, of, fob, eaoh count as one word.
5. Words joined by hyphens are counted as blyo or more words, acoording to the number of words employed.
 Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, or Latin languages are not permissible.
