

"Black spots" in the Senate

The contentious Bill to remove "black spots" was debated in the Senate on Monday. Under one clause, it was pointed out, an African can be banished from his home for ever without a trial.

"The Bill will make the African a virtual prisoner", said Senator L. Byron (United Party). All three elected Natives' Representatives, representing between them 8.000,000 people, protested violently against this latest version of aparelected Natives' Representatives. theid.
