We have had so much sadness and worry that no one of us has felt like writing letters. There hasn't been much to say. Mason is still jobless - Mary is still teaching - not married yet, though she and Jack are still engaged. She visited him, at the school in Texas where he is teaching at spring vacation time a few weeks ago. I have joined the ranks of those seeking jobs. I haven't had

any luck so far but am still trying. I feel that I must get something to do to help at home, and to help myself too. Wilbur's business is so very very dull. He is well as usual, and sends love to you.

Are there any jobs there in South Africa? I haven't yet forgotten my idea that I would spend a couple of years ^{or so} in Africa. Write to me sometime and tell me about the conditions down there. I've heard so much about them. Is Max Yerger anywhere near you? I met him once, years ago, in New York. I've read of him with much interest. Tell me, too, what bishop has charge of the school where you taught and the work of the A.M.E. church in Liberia, and other parts of Africa, if you know.

There are only the three at home now - Mary, Mason and Mother. Grandmother had a fall, downstairs, last July and never walked again. She died February 3 and was buried on Mary's birthday, February 6th. — Mother is only fairly well, but she is very brave in her loneliness. These are such discouraging times that it is hard not to worry.

We are glad you have such a nice husband and baby and home. You deserve all this and so much more happiness. I have always thought that one child misses so many things in life, if it is an only child. You will find much joy in your children. Take good care of yourself - and let us know of the little new arrival when it comes.

We think of you often, dear child, and hope we shall live to see each other again in this life.

Dear Bishop Sims,

The work on Gregg Hall is now completed and I went out last Friday afternoon to inspect and accept it. I was not able to get any other member of the committee to go, but Mrs Morake was there. Mr Bell and Mr Mitchell have made the building thoroughly secure and safe. I will enclose Mr Bell's account and covering letter. I shall be glad if you will send the £ 150 as soon as possible, as Mr Bell is a man in a small way of business and not able to carry heavy charges for any considerable time.

Mrs Morake asked for an estimate on the cost of dividing the dormitory into three sections so as make possible the separation of the boys, especially the younger from the older, but as it worked out at £ 90 we abandoned the idea for the present.

I have this morning a letter from the Education Dept. pointing out that the average attendance of the Higher Primary Dept. for 1933 was only 49 and for the first term of 1934 only 52. They consider that the three teachers being paid by the Dept. are not warranted by the average attendance and ask if there are any reasons why the staff should not be reduced by one teacher as from the end of the current term in June. I must reply to them very soon. I think that as soon as possible you ought to put in several days at least at Wilber-
