

# JAMES HOWARD PIM.

Upon the motion of Mr O.D. Schreiner, of Coursel for the Applicant, and upon reading the Petition filed setting forth that, as a result of a letter sent by the applicant and others to the "Star" newspaper of Johannesburg inviting subscriptions from the public for the purpose of providing compensation for natives who were killed and injured during the disturbances on the Witwatersrand during the early part of the year 1922, and requesting that any such subscriptions should be sent to the applicant as treasurer, as a result whereof a sum of £2,336.0.5 was collected and the sum of £1282-18:3 was paid out from this amount according to an arrangement between the Director of Native Labour and the applicant, leaving an unexpended balance of £1053:2:2 with accrued interest,

## IT IS ORDERED

That a Rule Nisi be, and is hereby, issued calling upon all persons interested to shew cause, if any, in this Court on the 15th November, 1923, why the applicant should not be authorised and directed to pay over to the "Bantu Mens Social Centre" (a Society formed in Johanness-burg with the object of forming a nucleus for social intercourse for natives employed on the Witwatersrand) the aforesaid sum of £1053:2:2, with interest accrued, after deducting therefrom the costs of this application.

That service of this Rule be effected on the Minister of Justice and by one publication.....
