B. X. Germiston asks: Where do flies go in the winter time? Why are flies dangerous to health? How can we get

The house-fly lays its eggs swatters, traps, sticky-papers in almost any place where there is decaying vegetable or animal matter. The eggs hatch out in anything from 8 hours to 4 days depending on temperature and moisture, into larvae or maggots. After a few days the larvae develop into pupae (when they have a into pupae (when they have a crust-like shell around them), and into the fly in another

In the winter-time the flies

other such places, and if you let them into your homes they will soon overrun the place, wiping their filthy feet on your food stuffs, on your milk, bread, sugar, jam, and whatever else they can find.

Flies can spread such dreadful diseases as Typhoid or Enteric-Fever, Dysentery, Infantile Diarrhoea, Intestinalworms, sores, and even Tuberculosis. The germs spreading these diseases have actually been found on, or in the bodies of flies, and these germs have been transferred to the articles on which the flies settle.

The best way to get rid of flies is to destroy their breeding places. Dust-bins must be covered with well-fitting lids, fubbish should be burnt or buried, and food should always be covered and kept in safe places.

A. The treatment of the insect bite depends on the type of insect which has bitten or stung you.

In the winter-time the flies remain in the pupal stage until the next summer, when they develop rapidly as soon as conditions suit them.

Flies are dangerous to health because of their filthy habits. They are always hanging round dust-bins garbage-cans, stables, manure-pits and other such places, and if you let them into your homes they will soon overrun the place, with the poison sac attached to it. The sting must be removed gently by means of a moved gently by running the needle through the flame of a match). Don't try to remove the sting with your fingers, that will only force more poison in.

After removing the sting.

After removing the sting, dab the skin with dilute am-monia bicarbonate of soda, or baking-powder (2 teaspoonsful to a pint of tap-water).

Mosquito-bites are best treated by dabbing the skin a few times with methylated spirits, or calamine lotion to stop the irritation.

Bites from bugs or fleas are eased by dabbing with spirits or calamine lotion. But the most important point is to get rid of the pests, otherwise they will continue to irritate you, and above all avoid scratching.



general impression to those living and working outside the Mines is that the African mine labour is only good at his mine job, with pick, shovel, machine-drill or crowbar. It would be an eye-opener to many to see the wealth of enter-tainment these labourers are capable of producing.

The great majority of mineworkers come by contract from their homes for certain periods, and return to their respective countries or reserves at the expiry of the contracts

Group life makes it easy for the labourers to indulge in their traditional dances during their spare time and provides them with week-end relaxation from their undoubtedly strenuous duties.

Some people who have seen mine dancers in action will probably argue that "relaxation" is not the right word to use because of the amount of effort and exertion put into most of these dances. But they should agree that with the average mine labourer's fit and nourished body, to re-lax does not mean lying down at all, but merely va-riety in action, which danc-ing supplies. 
