A circular from the Department of Social Welfare, Pretoria, was read, drawing attention to the section which provides for the payment of maintenance grants to non-European children to the end of the calendar year in which they attain the age of 15 years, and to the fact that the Department had decided that it shall be applicable only to Coloured children.

IT WAS AGREED to write to the Secretary for Social Welfare and ask whether Indian Children were included in terms of the regulation.
