

## Bernstein

In one year (1986) when at least 28,471 people were detained, approximately 10,000 of these were children 18 years of age and under. Law and Order Minister A. Vlok defended detaining 281 children aged 14 and under, admitted jailing children as young as 11, said there would be no early release . . . some were in detention because witnesses refused to testify against them. Children in jail have been tear-gassed, abunsed, systematically assaulted, terribly tortured, including electrical torture.
