


# COSAS SAYS:

The banning order has been revised for another 5 months. We have also come to the conclusion of boycotting schools. We have written a letter to the Minister of Education, Gerrit Viljoen as well as the P.F.P. member Ken Andrew where we are telling them that we will proceed with the boycott until our demands are met. What happened is that while the students did not attend the schools, on the 9th July, the police were posted to each and every school. The police are searching the one who wrote a letter to parliament.

We, the students of Port Elizabeth, East London, Grahamstown, Queenstown and Whittlesea, express our solidarity in your struggle at Cradock. The reason for all this is that we were given a minor education where we find ourselves very small generally. We want equal education so that we may all be equals.
