Dear Sir,

I have been requested by the Kenya Government to arrange sea passages for yourself and family from Durban to Mombasa in April, 1950.

The British India Line has only one sailing during that month, namely the s.s. "Amra" leaving Durban on the 20th April, 1950. Consequently reservations will be effected on this vessel and you should arrange to report to this office not later than the morning of the 19th April, 1950, for the necessary steamship tickets.

In the meantime, it is essential you obtain the following documents in order to facilitate your departure from South Africa :-

- (1) Passport with endorsement for entry into Kenya.
- (2) Yellow Fever certificate on International form.
- (3) Smallpox certificate on International form.

In regard to the two latter certificates, I must emphasize that these documents are only issued by the South African Government Health Officers at the larger centres, and no other form or certificate will be accepted.

Passengers travelling by sea are allowed 40 cubic feet free luggage, any amount in excess must be paid for, I must mention that this office is only concerned with your transport.

Heavy baggage, motor cars and household effects should be handled by an authorised shipping agent, payment for such services to be arranged by yourself.




