7.9 Notification of anticipated rent and tariff increases in the area of jurisdiction of the Town Council of Lekoa

RESOLVED

1. That it be noted that the 1984/85 estimates provide for an increase of R5,50 in site rental (payable in the Vaal Triangle area), of which the implementation date is anticipated to come into effect from 1 September 1984 after it was promulgated in the Government Gazette.
2. That the information contained in resolution (1) above, be conveyed by Councillors to residents at meetings to be held on 5 August 1984, in their respective wards.
3. That in regard to (1) above, the Town Clerk be requested to send written notices to all residents and employers who deduct site rental payments from the salaries of their employees.
4. That it be noted that the communication referred to in (3) above, must not precede the action referred to in (2) above.

The following advertisement appeared in the Rand Daily Mail and an Afrikaans version thereof in "Die Vaderland" on 31 July 1984 and 1 August 1984, respectively:

"NOTICE is hereby given that the Town Council of Lekoa has resolved subject to the approval of the Minister of Co-operation and Development to increase the various tariffs applicable in the area of jurisdiction of the local authority of Lekoa, with effect from the first day of the month in which the increase in the various tariffs has been published in the Government Gazette. Particulars of the resolutions are available in the office of the Town Clerk during normal office hours until Wednesday 15 August 1984. Any person who wants to object against the proposed increase in tariffs must lodge his objection in writing to the Town Clerk not later than Wednesday 22 August 1984."

The relevant regulation pertaining to the date on which a by-law comes into operation has since been amended and now reads as follows:

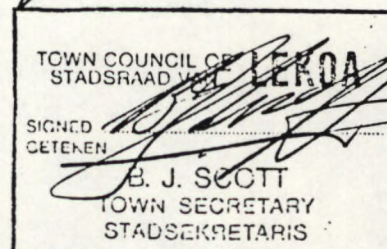
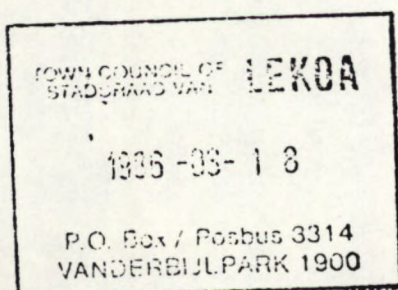
"(3) Any by-law shall have the force of law within the area of jurisdiction of the local authority concerned with effect from the date of the publication in the Gazette as provided in subregulation (2)(c) or from any such later date as may be indicated therein."

As no written objection against the proposed increase in tariffs was received the Council must now resolve for the necessary publication of the various tariffs in the Government Gazette.

IT IS RECOMMENDED

1. That the contents of this report and the advertisement pertaining to the proposed new tariffs for 1984/85 financial year be noted.
2. That in regard to (1) above a by-law be promulgated in terms of section 56(1) of the Black Local Authorities Act 1982 (Act 102 of 1982) as amended by Government Notice R.1993 of 16 September 1983.
3. That in regard to (2) above the Town Clerk be authorized to arrange for the necessary publication of the various tariffs in the Government Gazette during September 1984 to enable the Town Council of Lekoa to implement the new tariffs with effect from 1 October 1984.
