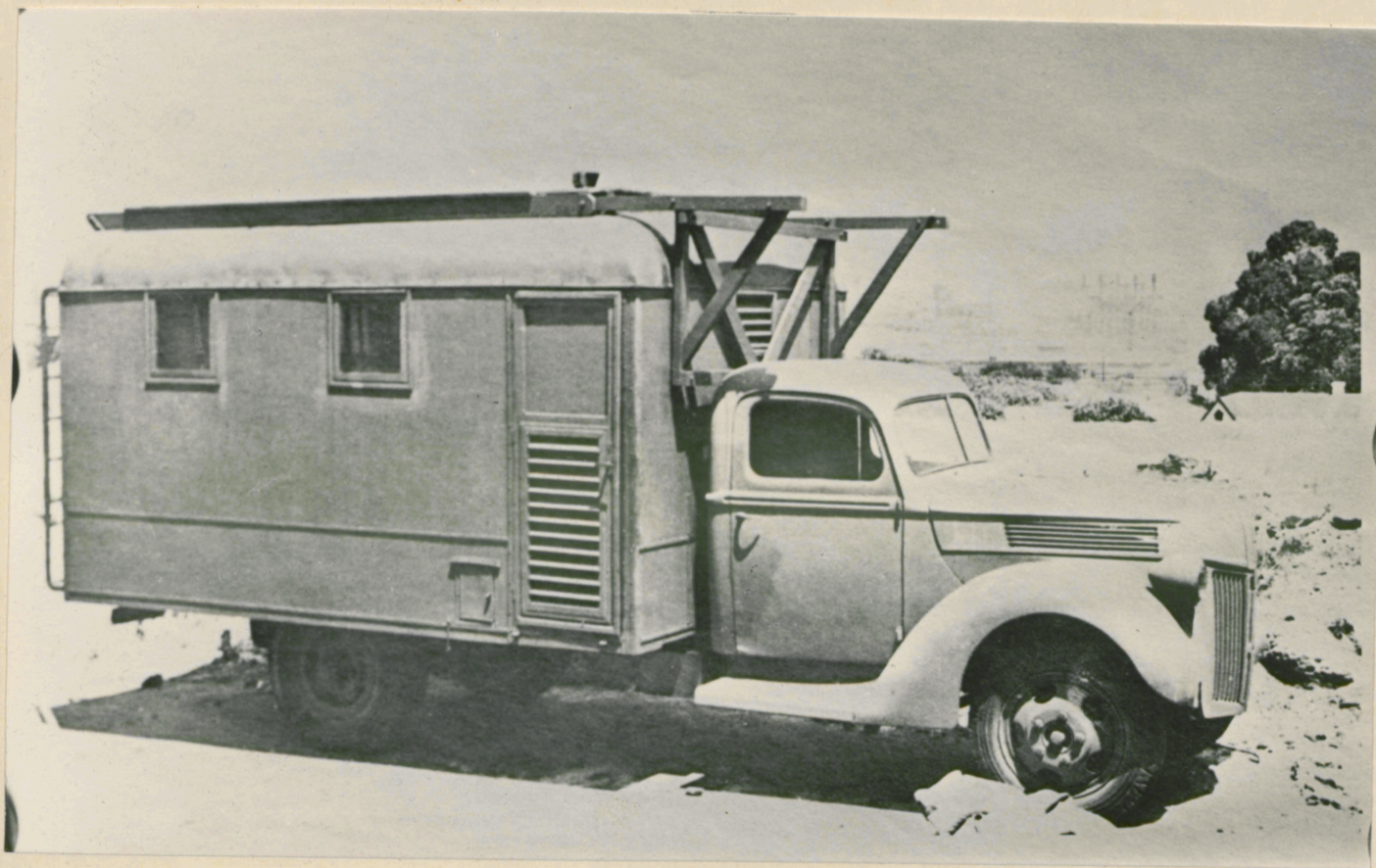

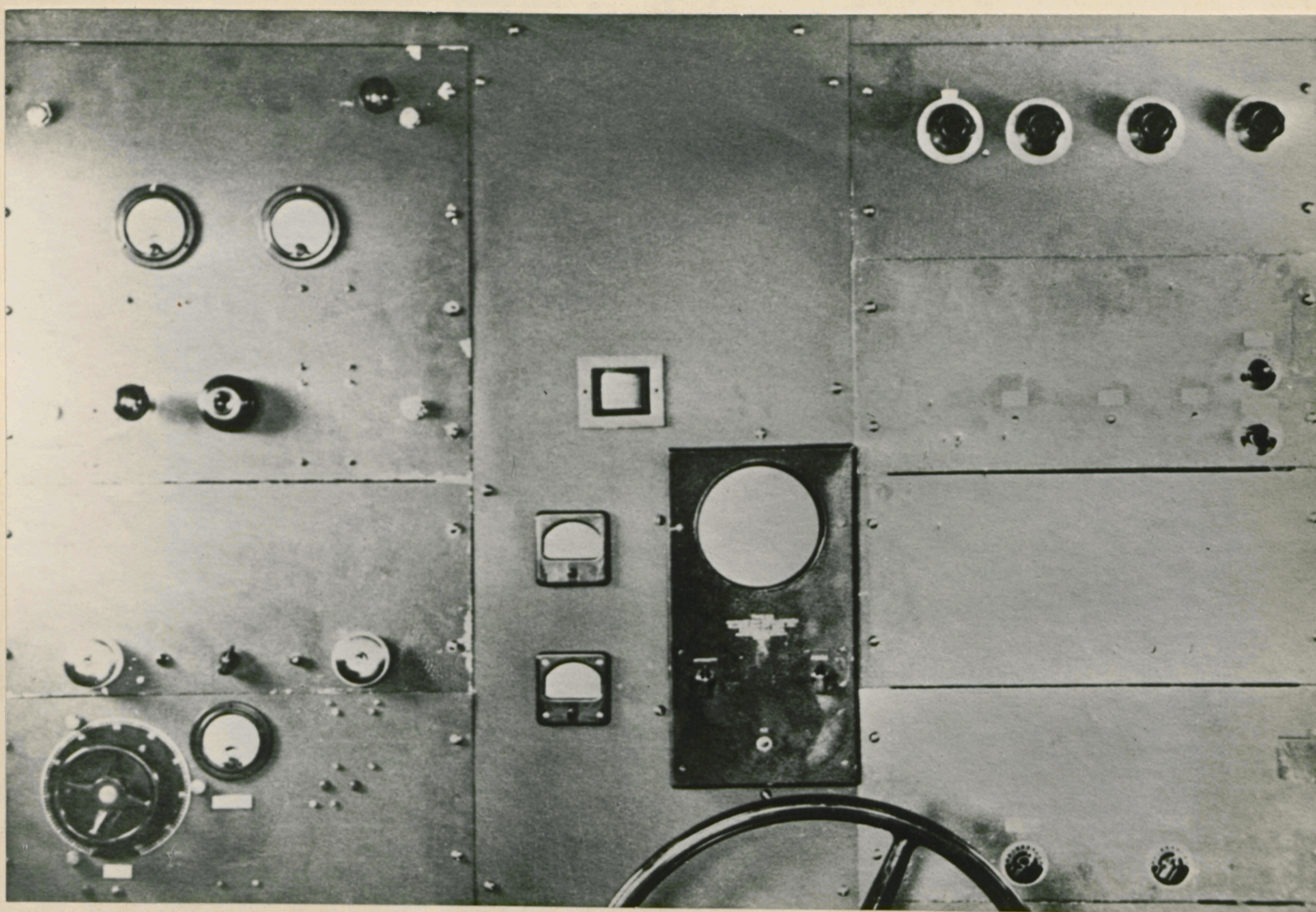


MAJOR T. L. WADLEY - GENERAL AND LATER, AIRBORNE RADAR.

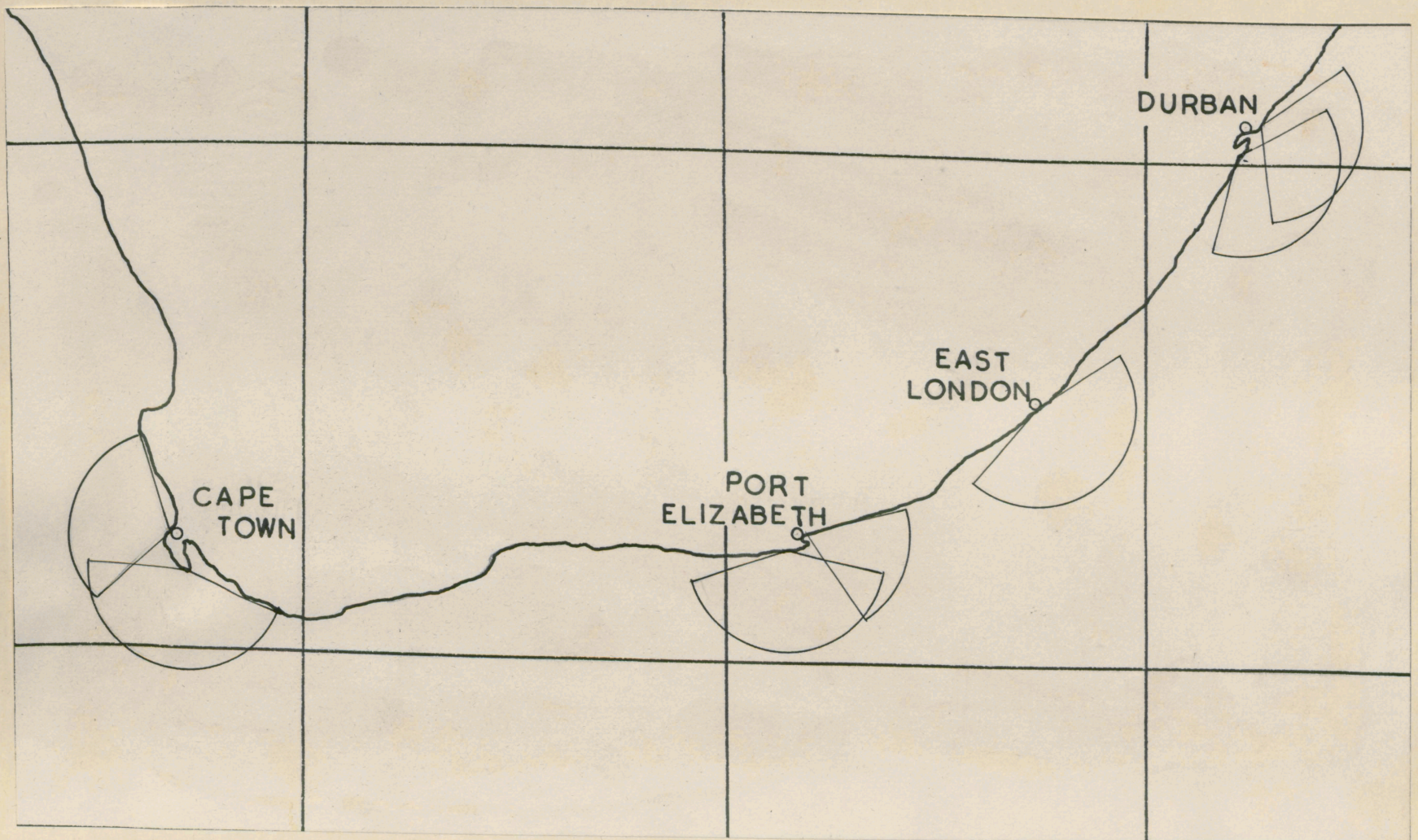
