1) Structures

agreed that ECC should maintain its federal / joint nature and consist of representatives of member organizations. These organizations needs to be involved as much as possible in the work of ECC, into there had been problems with regard to this - in all the different areas and attention needed to be given to ways of involving membership organizations more. Task

agreed that more organizations should be approached to send representatives to the local committees. Volunteers should be particularly interested in the work of ECC should not be discouraged by could be incorporated structurally depending on the particular region.

also agreed that some sort of coordinating structure was necessary in the respective ECC's to coordinate the work of the committee and to liaise (Need to clarify the respective and different roles of Long and ECC)

also necessary to have a person in each region responsible for maintaining contact with other regions. TASK

agreed to use the name and inscription committee nationally - although we are engaged in a campaign. noted that there had been no democratic decision making process with regard to deciding on the name - it had just 'happened' and we all liked the logo.

agreed that at some future stage there may need to be discussions around national structures especially with regard to finance. In the interim, shall be building a good deal can / will act as a contact person

2) ECC declaration and national launch

agreed that the next step in the campaign was to popularize the ECC declaration calling for an end to conscription and a just peace in SA and Namibia. noted that the word 'citizen' had been replaced by the word 'youth' in the declaration. agreed to use the present declaration.

accepted that as many organizations and individuals as possible should be approached to endorse the declaration and that we should use the declaration as a starting point for educating / informing people about the war in S.A and the need for conscription. this would imply pamphlets, press releases, media, visiting. agreed to have a national launch of the declaration on 15th October 1984 (deadline) the launch would take place at the respective centres but on the same day. TASK.

It is important that the campaign is seen as a national campaign, but also one that is part of the broader struggle for a just and democratic S.A linked with other organizations important TASK

also need person to take responsibility for knowing what is going on in other areas with regard to the declaratory campaign.

3. Survey.

Various surveys concerning attitudes to contraception have already been executed, while others are planned. The survey fills two functions: 1) provides us with data which needs to be analyzed and used 2) provides with an opportunity to get involved in a educational process. Survey must have the personal contact dimension TASK.

4) Patrons.

agreed that it would be advantageous for ECC to have patrons who would lend credibility to the campaign. agreed that this should be discussed at a regional level and then suggestions made nationally. agreed that there should be patrons from each region and that they should represent a broad spectrum of people who are public figures - Balance TASK. Sept deadline for names.

5) National Conference.

agreed that a national conference was necessary early next year - Proposed dates - 25, 26, 27 ^{January} ~~February~~ - (but not by the sea!) agreed that the conference would be task oriented - evaluation of campaign thus far and plan. although there should be some input and analysis (probably on evening night). Sudan ECC will be responsible for coordinating the conference although other areas will send suggestions and volunteers for tasks. TASK.

6) General 7) generally agreed that it was vital to build up better relationships with the press - TASK

AN ATTEMPT TO CUT DOWN ON LENGTHY REPORTS AT ECC MEETING 25.4.1985 . . .

1. REGIONAL REPORTS

- a. JOHANNESBURG — Successful joint meeting with SACC, Black Sash + JODAC on the Civil War — main speakers Sheena + Beyers — ± 500 attended
- b. DURBAN — have produced a series of excellent media as build-up to their meeting last week — Speakers: Laurie, Zac Yacoob, Ann Corwin + Paddy Kearney — ± 150/200 attended, + very good discussion from floor and in "rap groups".
- c. PORT ELIZABETH — ECC now officially launched — inaugural meeting gate-crashed by 60 UPE students, mainly drunk and very racist — handled well by ECC people — have produced first newsletter.

HARRASSMENT — Besides the PE incident, ECC slogans ("No to SADF", etc) were sprayed on the walls of Khotso House, Freeway House + the Catholic Cathedral in Jo'burg. ECC publicly dissociated.

2. PRESS

As I said last week, I wrote letters to the editors of both the Cape Times and the Argus concerning coverage of ECC activities. Responses:

- a. CAPE TIMES (Gerald Shaw) — Thanked me for the "kind words" I said in public — said that the term "Civil War" has "awesome implications" and "should only be used with great care and circumspection and appropriate qualification"
- b. ARGUS (A.P. Drysdale) — wording of our advert was "unacceptable" + "open to misinterpretation" — stated

that my assertion that the Argus has an un-stated policy of blocking coverage of the conscription issue, was incorrect.

I sent a letter with the statement of demands and the endorsers (from the 2 April meeting) to both the Argus + the Cape Times. Neither has yet been published.

We're getting very odd national coverage, eg Natal papers gave superb coverage to the spray-painting issue, but nothing to the Durban meeting. Argus covered the Durban meeting, but not our own, etc, etc.

3. STATEMENTS

- a. Issued a statement to the Argus + Cape Times on the "Dad's Army" call-up. Neither was published
- b. Did a statement of support for the CAYCO AGM

4. ARTICLE

A book is being brought out to coincide with the 30th anniversary of the Freedom Charter. ECC was asked to make a contribution. This was done in the form of a joint interview with Pete Mathorn + Laurie on C.O., ECC and the Peace issue.

5. OPEN MEETING

The first "open meeting" was attended by 25 people, 10 of whom were from ECC — Very useful discussion after talks on the history of CO, alternatives to conscription, the Board and Prison.

6. TEAM, + CIVIL RIGHTS LEAGUE, + THE QUAKERS

Dot is still recovering from her operation and hopes

to resume attendance at meetings soon.

Robin Peterson (the new TEAM rep) will start attending meetings when he finally completes his Ph.D

Victor has had to leave Cape Town and says farewell to all in ECC. We welcome Mary Ellis as the new Quaker rep.
