Memorandum of agreement made this sixteenth day of Oct. 05  
between Chief Elias Moleua of Mapekury, and Messrs Edgar & Richard  
Rowland of Mapekury hereinafter called the Lessees.

Witness as follows:—

- I The Lessor, his Heirs, or Assigns for the Consideration hereinafter mentioned doth hereby lease and let his Farm maturing situated about three miles <sup>west</sup> south of the Baralong town unto the said Lessees, their Heirs, or Assigns.
  - II That the duration of this lease or right shall last for a period of six years to be computed from date of this presents.
  - III The said Lessees, their Heirs, or Assigns agree to bind themselves to build — as well and absolute remuneration for the six years lease of the said farm — one four roomed ~~house~~ <sup>house</sup> outside measurements to be 30ft by 30ft — hip roof and rooms to be ciled with Calico
  - IV as a consideration for the <sup>for above building</sup> bricks, to be supplied by the Lessor the Lessees bind themselves to supply and plant fifty fruit trees on the farm.
  - V The said house to be completed before the expiration of the six years lease
