- AWHITE PROBLEM -

EXTRACTS FROM A SPEECH BY MR VAN HELS IN THE ASSEMBLY ON 28th May/20

Mr van Hees (Christiana) said that members seemed to think that the question cught to be looked at from the point of view of the natives, but as far as he was concerned he looked at it from the viewpoint of the white man. It was not a native problem it was a write problem, of the free existence of the white people in South Africa.

They must be honest to the native and just to the white man, and if he was called on to shoose he would say justice to the white man and injustice to the native every time. That was the history of South Africa. When their ancestors trakked to the North they did not go to civilise the natives. They were there for freedom and justice for themselves.

Continuing Mr van Hees stated that: The Prime Minister had said that the whole policy of the past had been unjust to the natives with a few exceptions. It was hypocrisy to say that white men were ready to do more than be honest and deal fair with the natives. The White people's policy had been for the protection of themselves and the present Bill, he feared was only a continuation of the hypocrisy he had referred to and if he had his way he would do away with European influence and give the country sovereign rights to deal with all natives South of the equator.

If they disfranchised every native in the country they would have honest native administration. Members who had native constituents always had to consider the native vote, otherwise there was a risk of their losing their seats.
