Ladies and Gentlemen:

Mr. Mayor, I believe that as far as civic government is concerned we can hold our heads high regarding our standards. What has made it possible for busy men to take on the onerous task of a Councillor has been the calibre of the City's officials. If Councillors had always to be looking over their shoulders, and not be able to accept the integrity of officials' recommendations the life of a Councillor would be most unpleasant and difficult.

Mr. Mayor, when I say we miss our associates at the City Hall we often think of you on the last Tuesday of the month when your Council Meeting is in progress. We often wonder what red herring has cropped up on the agenda leading to protracted debate. We wonder if Parkinson's Law is still observed - "that the time spent on discussing an item is in inverse proportion to its importance" - not that any of the retiring Councillors would ever have been guilty of this!! Mr. Mayor, I was very interested in your remark that there was a place in Council affairs for wise men who do not speak often - may there be many of them! So when your Council Meetings seem endless, remember we are safely tucked up in bed thinking of you in a very superior sort of way.

Councillors' families have indeed to make a sacrifice because of the disruption caused by attention to civic affairs. So to our families we wish to say a thank you for enabling us to play a part, and to our wives for backing their men. I met a friend who had recently retired. He was having lunch at a Club. I said, "George, I thought you had retired and that you would be lunching at home," and he said, "Yes, I have retired, but my wife told me she had married me for love and not for lunch." I hope our families are not finding us in the way.

To the new Councillors - we congratulate you on your interest in the City's welfare, for there are so few who are prepared to take part in this important tier of government. We are confident you will find your participation in civic affairs most interesting, and an outlet for your aspirations, and that you will uphold the integrity linked with Johannesburg's civic reputation. I said Civic

reputation - I regret to say not always linked with other reputations in this City.

Mr. Mayor and Councillors, once again our thanks for this gracious gesture. We are sincerely grateful for this kind thought and for the happy reunion.
