- FORWARD THEN - TO POSITIVE ACTION NOW.

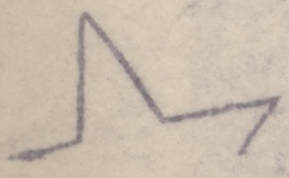
