I am additional Chief Magistrate, Johannesburg.

2.

on the 23rd day of August 1950, I was appointed as Liquidator of the assets of the Communist Party of South Africa by Second Respondent in terms of Section 3 of the Suppression of Communism Act, 1950, and was furthermore directed by him to compile a list of such persons as are referred to in Section 4(10) of the said Act. As such I have been cited as First Respondent in this matter.

3.

For the purpose of the appointment referred to in the aforegoing paragraph I have been assigned an

office with the department of Justice, Pretoris.

4.

On the 21st September 1980 the Deputy
Sheriff, Pretoria, served on me a copy of the rule nisi
granted by this Honourable Court on the 18th day of
September 1950, and I have since been furnished with,
and perused copies of the Petition completed by
Applicant at Cape Town on the 18th day of September
1950, and the annexures thereto including the
supporting affidavits referred to below.

5.

I admit paragraphs (1), (2), (3), (13) and (14) of Applicant's Petition.

5.

As I had information that Applicant is or was a member of the Communist Party of South Africa I addressed the communication of which annexure "A" to the said Fetition is a copy, to the Applicant.

77.

On the 5th day of May 1950, the Communist Party of South Africa was an existing organisation and Applicant a member thereof.

8.

I have no knowledge of the steps alleged to have been taken in order to effect the dissolution of the said Communist Party or of the alleged termination of Applicant's membership, association or support thereof, and do not admit either.

- (a) Save to the extent hereinafter stated, I do not admit paragraphs (6), (7), (8), (9), (10), (11) or (12) of Applicant's Petition.
- (b) I have reason to believe that certain transactions were carried out by the Communist Party after the date on which it is said to have been dissolved. I refer to and annex hereto a photostatic copy of a cheque dated the 23rd June 1950, from which it appears that it was at that date still operating on an account at the Pretoria East Branch of Barcleys Bank (Dominion, Colonial and Overseas). I also attach a photostatic copy of a deposit slip dated the 21st June 1950, from which it appears that on that date an amount of £17.10.0. was deposited to the credit of the Party's account at the aforesaid I have reason to believe that there is still a balance of £12.10.0. standing to the credit of the Party, and that the account has not yet been closed off.

10.

Furthermore, and in any event, I respectfully submit that the issues raised in the said Petition, both legal and factual, are issues to be determined by me in the discharge of my duties under the said Act, after having received, examined and considered all submissions and statements put forward by or on behalf of persons afforded the apportunity mentioned in Section 4 (10) thereof.

In any event, even if the allegations in paragraphs (7), (8), (9), and (10) of the said Petition were correct, I deny that the Communist Party of South Africa has cessed to exist, or that the Applicant has cessed to be an office-bearer, officer, member or active supporter thereof, in that:-

- (a) whereas the resolution referred to in the said paragraphs made the dissolution of the Communist Party conditional upon the Unlawful Organisations Bill passing a third reading in the House of Assembly, as will appear more fully from the attached affidavit by Jacobus Malan Hugo, the said Bill has not at any time passed any such third reading; and
- (b) In terms of the constitution of the Communist Party it could not lewfully be dissolved by resolutions of the Central Committee and/or general meetings of the District Organisations.

12.

As regards the affidavit of HOSES KOTANE:

- (a) Save that I do not admit that the said Moses
 Kotane has ceased to be a member or General
 Secretary of the Communeit Party of South
 Africa, I admit paragraph (1) thereof;
- (b) I simat paragraphs (2), (4) and (5) thereof;
- (c) Save as stated herein, I have no knowledge of

the/

the allegations in paragraphs (3), (6) (7), (9), (10), (11), (12), (13), (14), (15) and (16) hereof and I do not admit the same;

- (d) Ad paragraph (8); I respectfully refer to the Affidavit of Jacobus Halan Hugo attached hereto;
- (e) Save that I admit that the alleged dissolution of the Communist Party was generally reported in the press and in broadcast news service, I have no knowledge of the allegations in paragraph 17 and do not admit the same; and
- (f) I deny paragraph (18) thereof.

As regards the affidavit of ISAAC OSLER HORVITCH:

- (a) Save that I do not admit that the said

 Horvitch has ceased to be the Mational

 Chairman of the Communist Party, I admit

 paragraph (1) thereof; and
- (b) Save that I admit that the Suppression of Communism Bill was passed by Parliament on the 23rd day of June 1950, I deny paragraph (3).

- (a) Save that I do not admit that the said du Plessis has ceased to be Secretary for the Johannesburg District of the Communist Party, and save that I deny that the Communist Party has been dissolved, paragraph (1) thereof is admitted;
- Committee (or the Central Executive

 Committee (or the Central Committee) of the

 Communist Party on the 6th or 7th May

 1950, resolved that the said Party

 would dissolve on the day of the third

 reading of the Suppression of Communism

 Bill by the House of Assembly and in

 this respect refer to the attached

 which it appears that the Suppression

 of Communism Bill first emerged from a

Select Committee on the 5th day of June 1950; and

(c) I have no knowledge of the allegations in paragraphs (3), (4) and (5) thereof, and I do not admit the same.

As regards the affidavit of ARTHUR SHUMI DAWARE:

I respectfully refer to the aforegoing paragraph.

Save as stated herein I have no knowledge of the allegations therein and do not admit the same. In particular and he regards paragraph (2) I respectfully refer to paragraph 16(b) above.

I, JACOBUS MALAN MUGD of Cape Town, make oath and say:-

1.

I am the Clerk of the House of Assembly, and I know Applicant and Second Respondent.

2

Nouse of Assembly, Second Respondent moved for leave to introduce km a bill to prohibit certain activities detrimental to the interests of the Union, and to make provision for declaring organizations promoting such activities to be unlawful, and for prohibiting certain periodical or other publications, and for matters incidental thereto. After discussion, this motion was put and agreed to by the said House. Second

Respondent 2/...

Respondent thereupon moved that the Unlawful

Organizations Bill, a copy of which is attached
hereto and marked "A", be read a First Time and
this motion was also a greed to. So then moved
that the Second Reading of the said Bill be
taken on the 10th day of May, 1950, and this
motion was likewise adopted.

3.

Unlawful organizations Bill (with other matters on the Order Paper) was not reached and it remained in abeyance until the 19th day of May, 1950, when Second Respondent proposed to move, as an unopposed motion, that the Order for the Second Reading of the said Bill be discharged, and that the subject thereof be referred to a Select Committee for consideration and report, such Committee to have leave to bring up an

smended bill, and that it be an imstruction to such Committee to bring up its report not later than the 31st day of May, 1950. To this an objection was made and Second Respondent thereupon gave notice in terms of the rules of the House, that he would move a motion in these terms on the 22nd May 1950, as will appear more fully from a copy of the Votes and Proceedings of the said House on the 19th day of May 1950, which, is attached hereto and marked "B".

4.

On the 22nd day of May, 1950 the House agreed to the said motion and the Select Committee referred to therein was duly appointed.

Chairman of the Select Committee aforesaid submitted a special report requesting that the date by which the Committee was in terms of the motion above-mentioned to submit its report, be extended until the 5th day of June, 1950, and to this the House agreed.

6.

On the 5th day of June, 1950, the said Chairman brought up the Select Committee's Report, in terms of which it reported an amended Bill entitled the Suppression of Communism Bill (a copy of which is attached hereto marked SCB).

7.

on the date last-mentioned Second Respondent moved that the Report and proceedings of the Select Committee be printed and he further moved, as an unopposed motion, that the First Reading of the Unlawful Organizations Bill (annexure "A" hereto) be discharged, and that the said Bill be withdrawn. Both these motions were agreed to by the Rouse as will appear from a copy of the Votes and Proceedings thereof on that date which is attached hereto and marked "D".

· 8.

The said Unlawful Organizations Bill.

could therefore not be proceeded with and did in
fact at no time passa Second or Third Reading in
the House of Assembly.

9.

on the 5th day of June, 1950, furthermore, and by direction of Mr. Speaker, the Suppression of Communism Bill (annexure "C" hereto), as submitted

a first time in the House of Assembly. Thereafter Second Respondent moved that the said Suppression of Communism Bill be read a Second Time on the Sth day of June, 1950. Applicant thereupon moved as an amendment to the said motion, that for the word "eighth" there be substituted the word "fifteenth" but this amendment was negatived, and the House of Assembly adopted the motion as moved by Second Respondent.

10.

The Suppression of Communism Bill with other matters on the Order Paper, was not reached on the 8th day of June 1950, but on the 14th day of June, 1950, Second Respondent moved that the said Bill be read a Second time. The debate on this motion was continued on the 15th day of June, 1950, and after two amendments which had been proposed were defeated on divisions, the said Bill was read a Second Time, as will appear more fully from a copy of the Votes and Proceedings of the said House on the date last-mentioned, which is attached hereto marked "E".

11.

The Committee Stage of the Suppression of Communism Bill was set down for the 17th day of June, 1950, and the House considered it on that date and on the 19th idem, when the said Bill went through the Committee stage, - the Report Stage being set down for the 20th day of June, 1950. On the last-mentioned date and after the Report Stage had been taken, the House of Assembly passed

The Third Reading of the Suppression of Communism

Bill, which in due course became the Suppression

of Communism Act, 1950.
