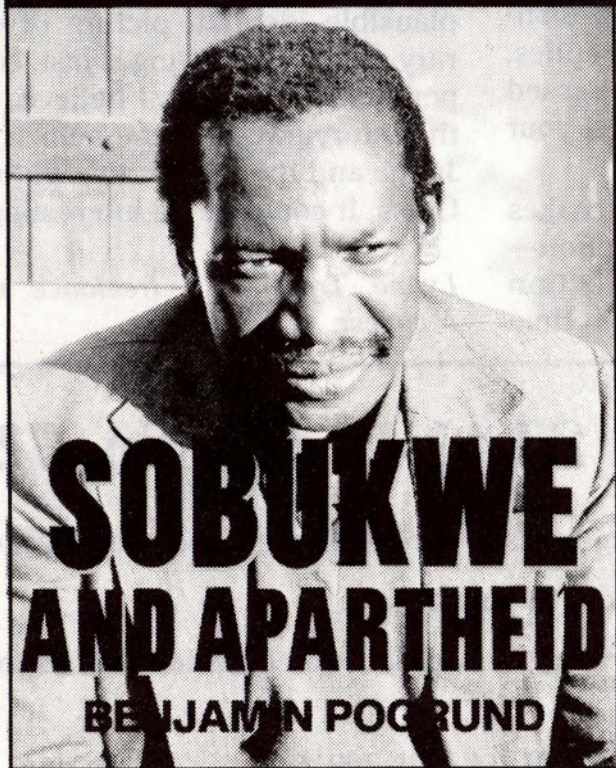

Exactly 30 years ago Robert Sobukwe led a non-violent black protest against the pass laws in South Africa. The police opened fire, resulting in a massacre. 'Sharpeville' was a turning point; Afrikaner rule hardened and black resistance went underground. It was Sobukwe's last day of freedom. A journalist and close friend of Sobukwe's, Benjamin Pogrund was present at Sharpeville and became Sobukwe's lifeline to the outside world during his imprisonment and banishment.

Benjamin Pogrund the former Deputy Editor of the Rand Daily Mail, came to England after the newspaper closed down. He appears frequently in the media as a commentator on South Africa.
