



In conclusion we hope that we will have a fruitful BGM and also wish TASA and especially the new executive strenght for the next two years.

### Message from the President

### Mr A.E. Fortuin

TASA events at national level are few and far between If this had been a normal society, this would never have been the case. Nonetheless, despite the restrictions that this abnormal society has placed on the majority of people who have the basic human right to call themselves South Africans, we have created structures and opportunities that ensure that such events do take place, and that they serve far more than being merely sports occasions.

During the year we have used them as prototypes of what we envisage the New Society shall have to offer to its members: occasions where members of the human race meet as equals in human dignity and worth; where their equality in rights is respected; and where the inequalities and imbalances that 'race' has imposed upon us are being addressed.

This 12th TASA National Open tournament is one such opportunity to give expression to our belief in the Non-racial principle, our commitment to principled action to implement that belief, and to set an example to whom it may concern that, despite differing tongues, religions, traditions, culture and skin colour we can live and play as an undivided fraternity.

It is matter of concern that these fundamentals, today, are being challenged in certain circles which try to promote a purely party political agenda; that the principle is being prostituted to convey a perception that fits a specific party political philosophy; and that principled action against racialism is actively undermined and expediency, in order to gain funds and privileges, is openly propagated.

It is also a matter of grave concern that our DEMANDS have have relegated to the back-burner, that what we lay claim to as BASIC HUMAN RIGHTS have become issue of horse-trading.

These are issues that touch the very basis and being of our association.

Each of us can make a significant contribution towards the STRUGGLE to see our vision of a single, non-racial democratic society become a reality, if we use this opportunity to freely and democratically discuss and decide upon those issues that not only are the cause of much disunity, but have caused the STRUGGLE to be diverted from the aims that are inherent in the Non-racial principle: A NON-DISCRIMINATORY, NON-RACIAL AND NON-EXPLOITATIVE NEW SOCIETY OF OUR MAKING and NOT a revised version of Aparthei granted by Apartheid.

We owe it to ourselves and to the future generations to ensure that this opportunity is used as best we can.

Despite voluminous talks about a "New South Africa" and "irreversible change" nothing in our lot has changed or improved. The suffering of our people is increasing day by day, the so called ideological war is escalating in our townships and ghettos.

The so called famous speach from "Parliament" of February 2 has exposed in our ranks those that are truelly committed to the struggle for liberation on one side, and those who were climbing a bandwagon for their own reasons. People are talking of those who are negotiating and those who are waging the struggle, and the chasm between the two is evidently growing.

TASA stands firm and resolute to the total eradication of apartheid and its exploitation. We do not believe in piecemeal reforms of the evil system. We now expereince a middle-of the-road force which seek to "allay the fears among the establishment sport". This force is deluding the establishment sport with promises of unity for international participation. No doubt some of our members are attracted by this package.

TASA has still a vital role to play and TASA is here to stay for a long time.

Let us therefore resolve our differences over a table and strive for development of our game in preparation for the new order where all will take their rightful place.
