EXEMPTION CERTIFICATE NO. 498.

Greetings:

Whereas, under the provisions of the "Coloured Persons Relief Ordinance, 1903" (Orange Free State), I am empowered to sign Letters of Exemption granted to any coloured person residing in the Province of the Orange Free State and coming within any of the classes of coloured persons described in Section 1 of the said Ordinance; and whereas residing at the present time at in the District of (Orange Free State), has in conformity with the provisions of the said Ordinance been deemed to be entitled to be relieved from the operation of certain Laws mentioned in the said Ordinance:

Now know ye that by and under the provisions of the said Ordinance, the said has been and is hereby declared to be exempted from and taken out of the operation of the Laws relating to Passes affecting coloured persons.
