His painting of Township life caught the attention of the art establishment [even bought by the gallery that had refused to employ him as a floor cleaner]. In this striking tribute he talks about his struggle to retain his South African identity as an alien culture, a place where at first he understood not a word of the language, and where he was confined to a mental asylum.

The paintings and drawings speak loudest - the white hot noon day sun burning on the browns and blues of the townships : the eloquent faces of fellow inmates in the asylum.

Now his work is on show again, in the land of his birth - an inspiration to a new generation of black South Africans who are discovering that the concept of being an artist does exist.

We're in Hoop Dreams country. Thuso, whose father has been murdered in a car jacking, may have to wave his dreams goodbye, to support his family. And Seth? Bound for Ajax Amsterdam.
