My Friend,

In accordance with your request
I write to place on record the
terms and conditions on which
you formerly agreed and your
Headmen today unanimously
consented in presence of your
Missionary the Rev. R. F. Appelbe
of the Wesleyan Mission,
G. J. Boyes Esq. Civil Commissioner
and Resident Magistrate of
Mafeking, M. J. Hall Esq.
my Private Secretary, and myself
to withdraw the Petition against
the

the annexation of this Territory to the
Cape Colony, viz. -

- (1) That the Native Reserves be retained for the use of the Natives in terms of the Award of the Land Commission of 1886.
- (2) That the present jurisdiction of Native Chiefs over their own people be preserved in terms of Proclamation No. 2. B. B. 1885.
- (3.) That all the Laws prohibiting the supply of liquor to Natives in this Territory remain in force.
- (4.) That the pension of £300 per annum at present paid to Montsira be continued to him

him for life by the Cape Government
and that after his death a pension
of £150 per annum be paid to
his successor so long as the latter
remains Chief of the Bora Telle
Barolong.

(5.) That the European Township
of Mafeking shall remain a
seat of Magistracy.

(6.) That the 'Glen Grey' Act 1894
of the Cape Colony shall not be
put in force in British
Bechnanaland without special
legislation assented to by Her
Majesty the Queen.
