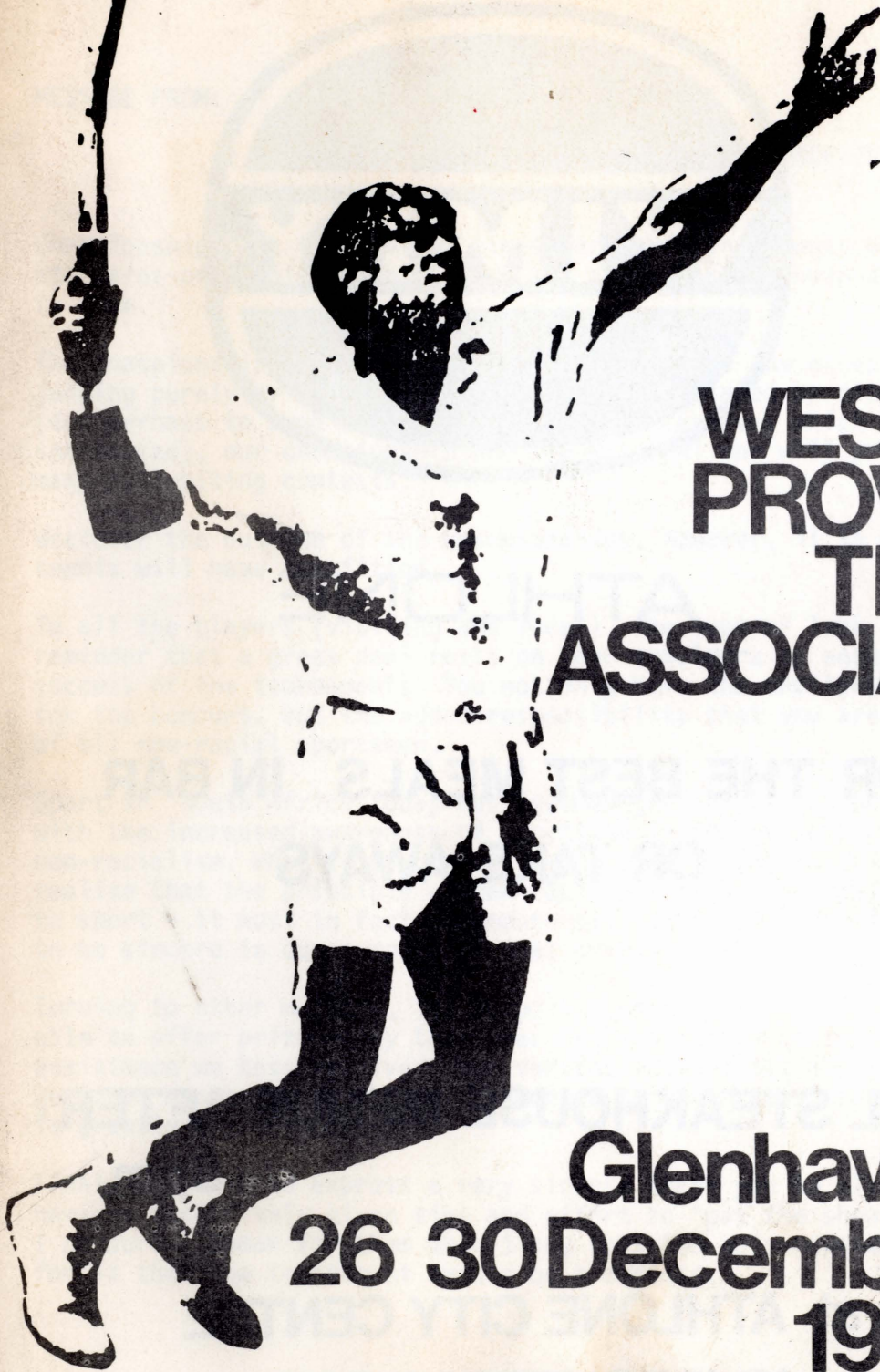

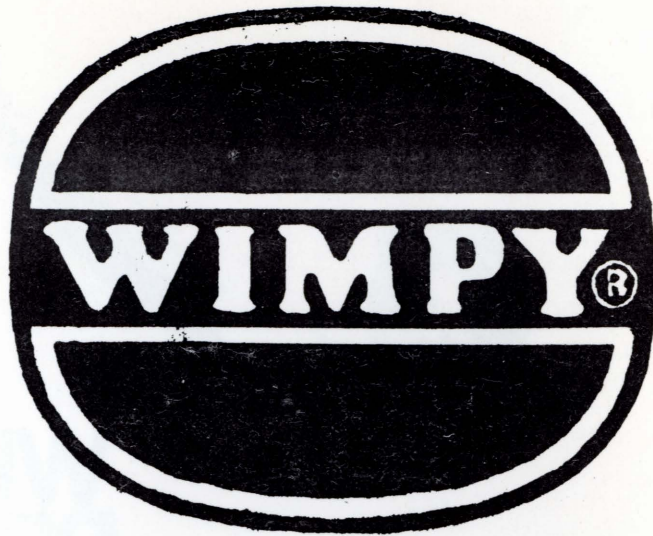

Y. EBRAHIM - PRESIDENT - WESTERN PROVINCE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

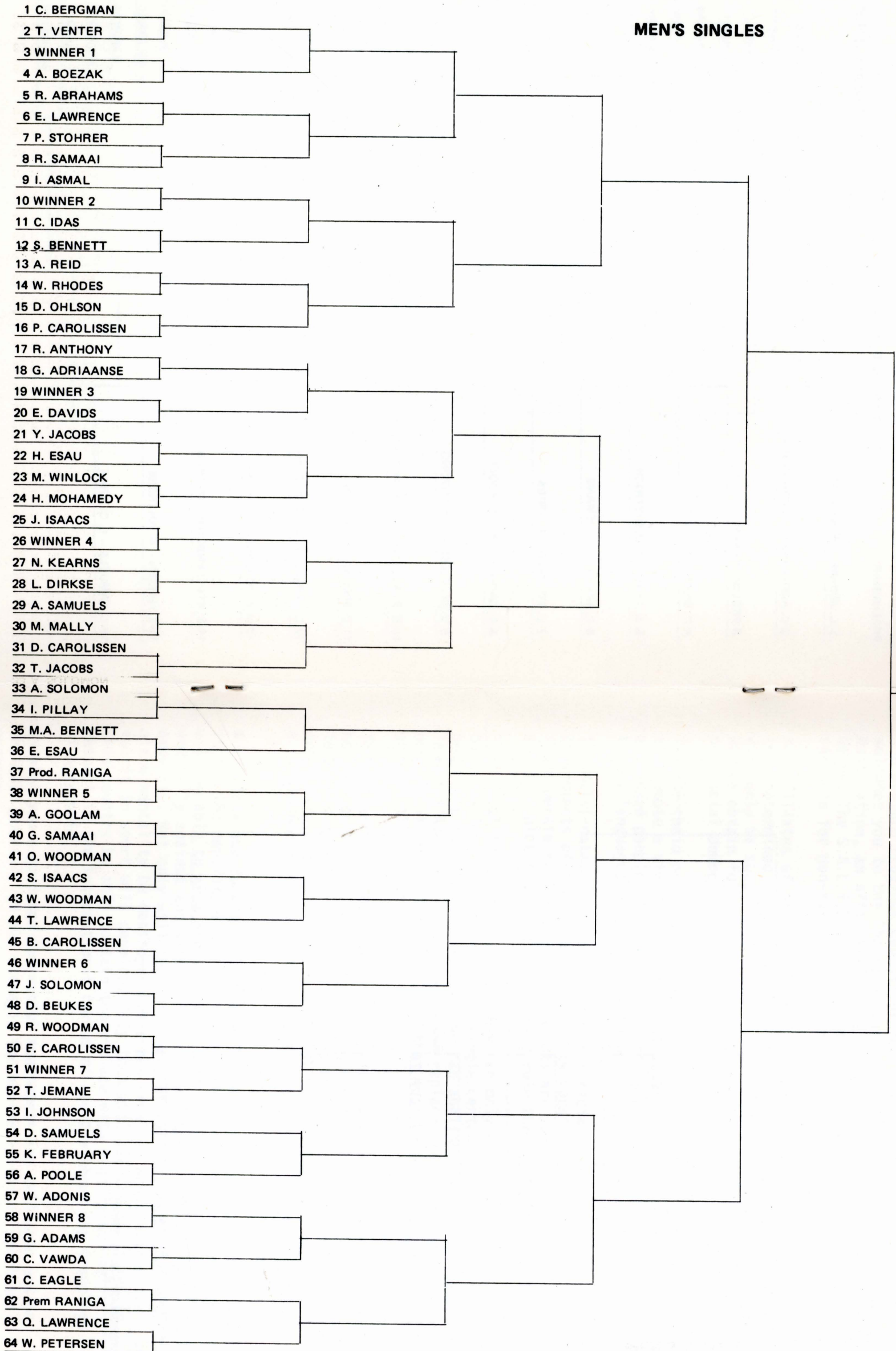

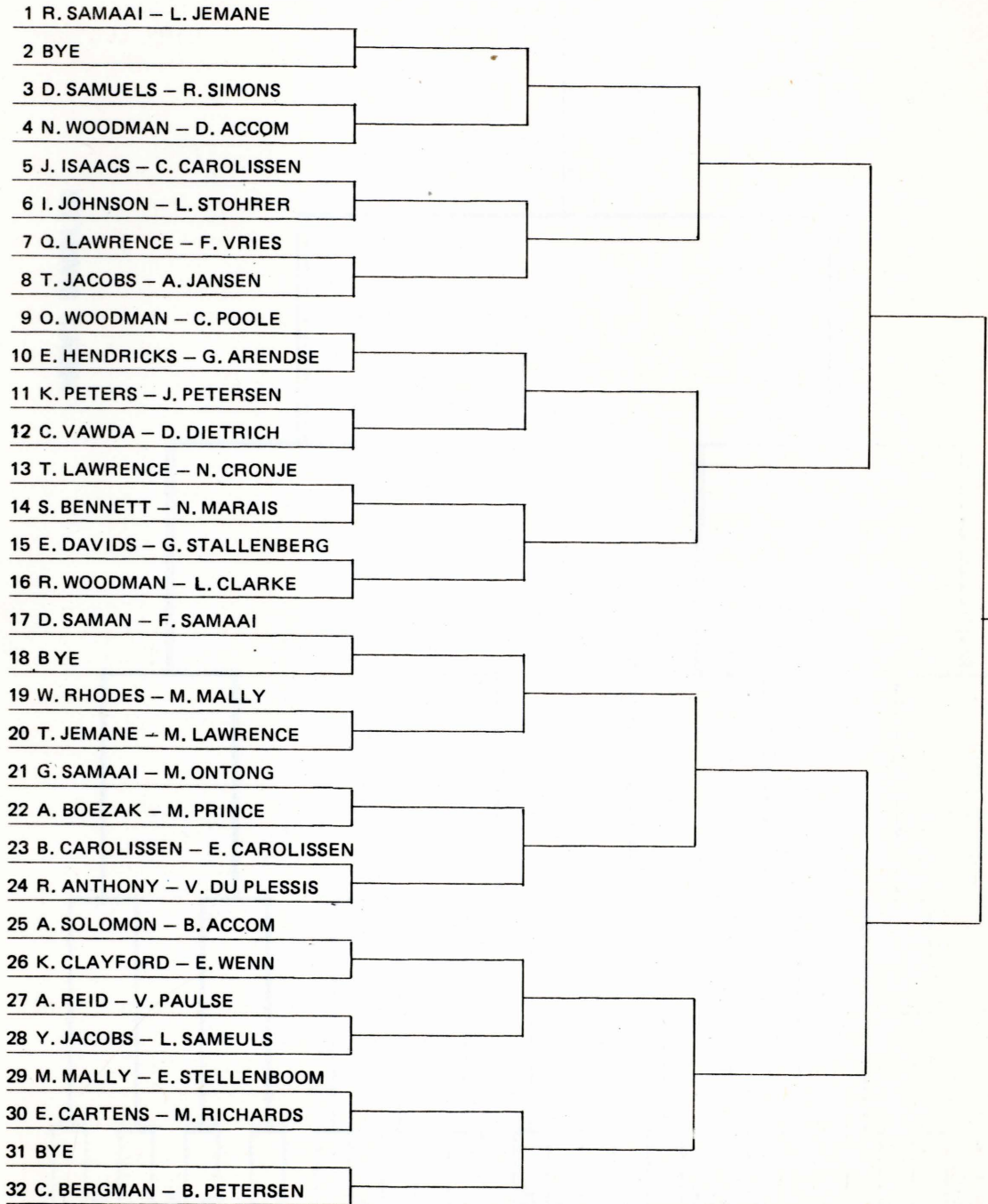

F.VAN DER HORST - PRESIDENT - WESTERN PROVINCE COUNCIL OF SPORT

The Western Province Council of Sport extends fraternal greetings and welcomes you to the Championships of the Western Province Tennis Association, an affiliate of the non-racial South African Lawn Tennis Union. The S.A.L.T.U. has a proud and distinguished record in the struggle for non-racialism in sport and society.

As affiliates of the South African Council of Sport, we are united in a determined struggle against racial discrimination. This struggle will only be successful when the disenfranchised people of South Africa obtain full and equal political rights in a single, united non-racial democracy.

The Apartheid or Multi-national policy in sport and society is designed to promote a vicious racialism. Its aim is to divide and fragment the oppressed people of this country into hostile groups based on colour, tribe, language, religion and culture.

The Multi-national sports policy, the racial laws, the racial departments of the state and the "new Constitutional Proposal" with its separate racial dummy Parliaments are part and parcel of this sinister plot to divide and thereby rule the oppressed people.

Full equality in sport and society can only come when all the people can vote for (or be voted to) a single central parliament. With this new right to self determination we can abolish the discriminatory laws and Apartheid institutions and replace them with democratic and non-racial institutions and laws that must be for the benefit and good of all the people.

The present Multi-National sports policy with its permit system and hollow concessions that are based on the Apartheid Group Areas, locations and pass laws must then be abolished. The present racial and separate educational systems must be abolished and replaced by a single non-racial educational system that must be open to all students.

A complete and fundamental change in sport and society must be ushered in for the benefit of the entire population. Then non-racial sport will be able to grow and sportsmen will be able to compete freely and fully against and with each other on a basis of complete equality. Not only will the evil ideas of racialism and the crippling slave mentality be destroyed but a new creative and constructive spirit in sport will develop. Only then will all the sportsmen in this country be able to take their place with dignity and self-respect in the international forums of sport without any trappings of Apartheid.

We wish you a good and successful tournament and call upon you to dedicate yourself to the struggle for non-racialism in sport and society.

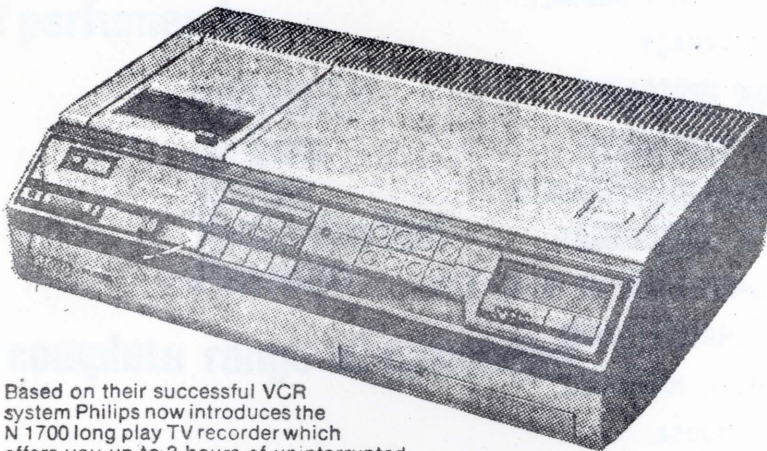
