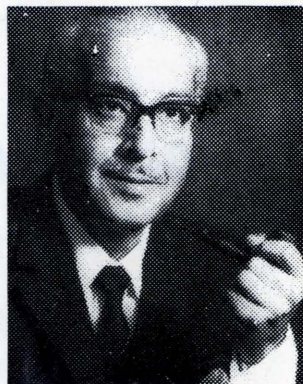

Good luck to you all!

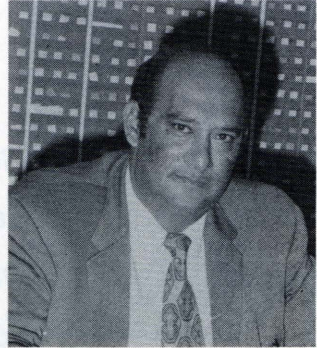

M. LUCKAY

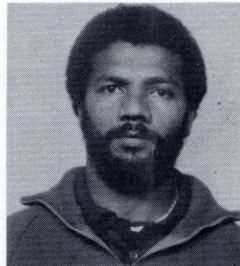

THE EXPEDITE SYSTEM

If play, the game shall be interrupted and the rest of the game, and the rally shall be resumed under the Expedite System.

If twelve successive good returns of the serving player or pair are each made, the server shall lose a point.

If play is interrupted, play shall restart with service by the player who served in the rally.

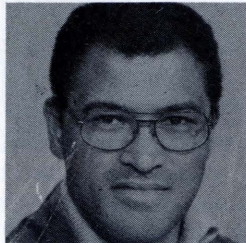
GLEN JACKSON

This man needs no introduction. He is the defending Champion of Champions and has captured this title on several occasions.

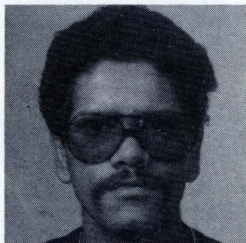

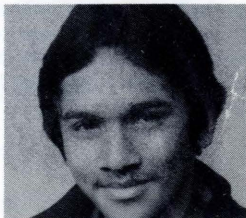
WILMA VAN NIEKERK

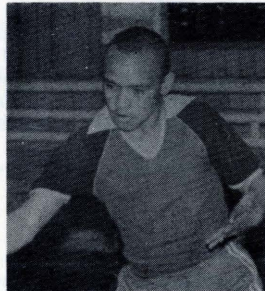
J. PHILLIP (Junior Representative)

Since then he has remained unbeaten as a junior and is regularly ranked in the first eight senior players.

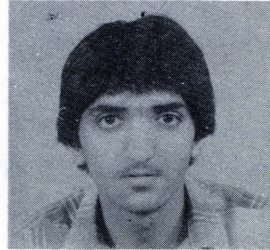
This National Tournament will definitely spur young Joey to even greater heights and his total dedication to the game.

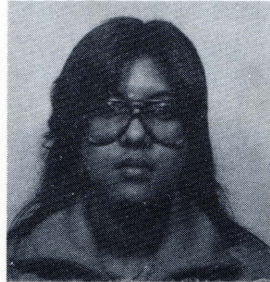
Men's Representative:

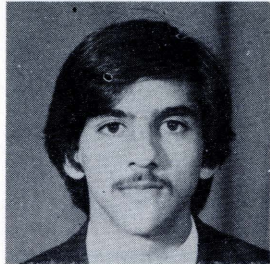
Ladies' Representative:

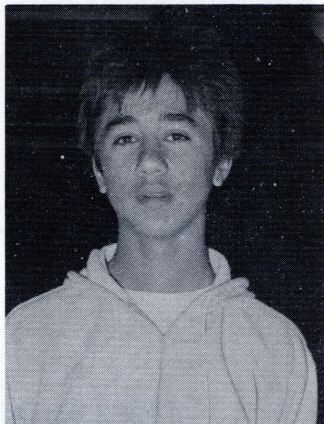
